During my assessment, Pure Love Day Care II has met the staff/child ratio.

- (1) Electrical: No insufficiencies to report.
- (2) Signage: No deficiencies found and none of the children enrolled have an allergy.
- (3) Emergency: Most of the first aid kit are filled with updated medical supplies. However, the first aid kit in the Infant Room needs to be refilled with bandages. In addition, Ms. Bona informed that there are no changes with the submitted and approved Emergency Procedures and Respond Plans for the center.
- (4) Sanitary: Facility is cleaned with no odor. However, it was snack time and children were eating when I arrived to the center and crumbs were witnessed on the tables/floor.
- (5) Outdoor: The measurement of facility's outdoor playground is estimated at one 1,040.25 sq. ft. that can accommodate 14 occupants and the other ground measured about 2083.5 that can hold 28 people. The playground is enclosed, organized, furnished with age appropriate toys, and is cleared of heavy equipment. However, children outdoor time was never observed because during my assessment it was snack time for all the age group.
- (6) Capacity: All the observed rooms are within the capacity.
- (7) Health: No deficiencies found.
- (8) Documents: No insufficiencies to report.
- (9) Other: Ms. Bona explained that with the attained training of the staff, she had to reshuffled the staff according to their accomplished training. I inform Ms. Bona to update our office with the list of reshuffled assigned position of the concerned staff.
