### Staff Child Ratio

The Provider met the Staff Child Ratio for their K-4 level. Staffs are present and are within the ratio capacity. Nothing to report for any discrepancies or violations.

### (1) Electrical

- The facility complies on all the electrical safety aspects. However the following is recommended:
  - All unused electrical outlets must have plastic safety covers when not in use.

### (2) Signage

- Most of the important signage's are visible and posted on proper designated areas. However, the following is recommended:
  - There is no "Exit" sign available at the time of inspection. It is paramount that an "Exit" sign be posted on the exit door. The teacher must explain to the children the intent and purpose of such sign.

### (3) Emergency

- Emergency equipment's are installed at the facility (landline, alarm smoke detector) to include emergency plans posted. However, the following is recommended:
  - The large size fire extinguisher located by the entrance door is unlabeled. None indicating when was the last inspection. Recommended to be labeled.
  - The first aid kit must be monitored and replenished on a regular basis.

### (4) Sanitary

- The facility is for the most part, odor free, practicing sanitizing continuously prevention from any bacteria. Disposable paper towels are provided. However, the following is recommended:
  - The carpets used by the children for napping or leisure purposes has to be shampooed and kept clean at all times thereafter. Currently, it has an older, filthy, and must be clean. Rose



### (5) Outdoor

- The facility's outdoor playground is safe for children enrolled at this Day Care Center to utilize. The playground has a courtyard style fencing. However, the following is recommended:
  - The abandoned building adjacent to the playground must be barricaded to block children's access in entering for safety of the children.
  - Currently, the children have full access to the abandoned building through a stairway. Additionally, about midway through the stairway, broken glasses are scattered. The safety hazards this presents are obvious.
  - A CUC wire running along the school campus connects to the abandon building's meter box. At the meter box, an exposed/cut wire is clearly visible at the time of inspection. However, it is not known whether the wire has electrical current or not. Nonetheless, this needs to be addressed to prevent curious children from exploring it. This is only applicable and limited to children in Room C111 and C112.

### (6) Capacity

• The outdoor as well as the indoor facility for this Provider complies with the required square footage of space per child. *Nothing to report for any discrepancies or violations*.

### (7) Health

• The children's health insurance and their emergency contacts are all readily available at the Providers facility file. The staff practices washing their hands before and after eating as well as properly sanitized continuously counters/tables/chairs tops. *Nothing to report for any discrepancies or violations.* 

### (8) Documents

• The facility has been issued a new CCLP license. *Nothing to report for any discrepancies or violations.* 

### (9) Other

 Drinking water dispenser is readily available at all times for staff and children. Nothing to report for any discrepancies or violations.

### (1) Electrical


- The facility complies on all the electrical safety aspects. However the following is recommended:

### (2) Signage

- The signage's are not visible nor are they posted on the proper designated areas. As a result, the following is recommended:
  - There is no "Exit" sign available at the time of inspection. It is paramount that an "Exit" sign must be posted on the exit door. The teacher must explain to the children the intent and purpose of such sign.
  - There are no daily activities for the children posted. This must be posted in a conspicuous place within the facility.
  - There was no visible evacuation plan posted. This must also be posted in a ✓ conspicuous place within the facility.
  - There are no emergency preparedness drills posted(tsunami-earthquake-fire-flood). Again, this must be posted in a conspicuous place within the facility.

### (3) Emergency

- Emergency equipment's are installed at the facility (landline, alarm smoke detector) to include emergency plans posted. However, the following is recommended:
  - The large size fire extinguisher located by the entrance door is unlabeled. No label indicating the last inspection and recharge date is highly advisable.



There was no first aid kit located at the time of inspection. It is of the utmost importance that a first aid kit is accessible and stationed at a noticeable location and must be replenished on a regular basis.

### (4) Sanitary

- The facility is for the most part, odor free, practicing sanitizing continuously prevention from any bacteria. However, the following is recommended:
  - The trash receptacle in the classroom by the teacher's desk was overflowing with trash and left over food. The trash receptacle must be emptied and cleaned on a daily basis to protect the health of the children as well as the provider.

### (5) Outdoor

- The facility's outdoor playground is safe for children enrolled at this Day Care Center to utilize. The playground has a courtyard style fencing. However, the following is recommended:
  - The abandoned building adjacent to the playground must be barricaded for safety purposes.
  - The children have full access to the abandoned building through a stairway. Additionally, about midway through the stairway, broken glasses are scattered. The safety hazards this presents are obvious.
  - A CUC wire running along the school campus connects to the abandon building's meter box. At the meter box, an exposed/cut wire is clearly visible at the time of inspection.
