Staff Child Ratio

- The Provider for the most part, met the Staff Child Ratio. Staffs are present but some are not within the ratio capacity. The following are my findings and recommendations:
 - A. Infant: There were four infants being cared for by Ms. Wilma, which met the ratio. However, one toddler was asleep in one of the cribs. According to Ms. Wilma, the toddler's father requested that he be put to sleep. In this situation, one additional staff is required to meet the ratio. 55-40.1-228(a) "The staff-child ratio shall be met and maintained by all facilities".
 - B. K-3: There were eleven children and one staff member, which was Ms. Analyn Danan. According to Ms. Danan, two of the children were sitting in only. In this situation, there should have been one Teacher and one Aide to meet the ratio. 55-40.1-228(a) "The staff-child ratio shall be met and maintained by all facilities". Additionally, see Ratio Chart II, Minimum Staff Employment Sequence for Children Age Three on the following page succeeding the above administrative code.

(1) Electrical

 The facility complies on all the electrical safety aspects. However, the following is recommended:

Received by msngr 3/28/17 A. The light bulb located in the infant toilet needs to be replaced. It failed to turn on when I tested it on my initial announced inspection on March 1, 2017 and again on March 23, 2017. 55-40.1-272(a) "Child care facilities shall conform to the zoning, building, electrical.....(c) "All buildings, building appurtenances, outdoor space, equipment, and all other parts of the facility shall be kept repaired, safe, and sanitary at all times".

(2) Signage

• Important signage's are visible and posted on proper designated areas. Nothing to report for any discrepancies or violations.

(3) Emergency

• Emergency equipment's are installed at the facility (landline, alarm smoke detector) to include emergency plans posted. *Nothing to report for any discrepancies or violations*.

(4) Sanitary

• The facility is odor free, practicing sanitizing continuously prevention from any bacteria. *Nothing to report for any discrepancies or violations.*

(5) Outdoor

• The facility's outdoor playground is safe for children enrolled at this Day Care Center to utilize.

(6) Capacity

• The outdoor as well as the indoor facility for this Provider complies with the required square footage of space per child. *Nothing to report for any discrepancies or violations*.

(7) Health

• The children's health insurance and their emergency contacts are all readily available at the Providers facility file. The staff practices washing their hands before and after eating as well as properly sanitized continuously the counters/tables/chairs tops. Nothing to report for any discrepancies or violations.

(8) Documents

• The facility has been issued a new CCLP license. The Provider's CCL expires on **December 28**, 2017. Nothing to report for any discrepancies or violations.

(9) Other

- Drinking water dispenser is readily available at all times for staff and children. The following is recommended:
 - A. The peeled ceiling paint in the main building has not been addressed. Immediate corrective measures must be taken as this poses an obvious health and safety issue for the children and staff members. 55-40.1-272(c) "All buildings, building appurtenances, outdoor space, equipment, and all other parts of the facility shall be kept repaired, safe, and sanitary at all times".
