• Upon inspection, I discovered that there was no exit sign on the main door of the center. Therefore, it is recommended that an exit sign be posted on every exit door within the center.

(3) Emergency

- Emergency equipment's are installed at the facility (landline, alarm, smoke detector) inclusive of the posting of emergency plans. However, the following are recommended:
 - The fire extinguishers are due for its annual inspection on November 2017. It is recommended that an inspection is scheduled with Fire Department or Safety First.
 - According to the teacher, she does not conduct an emergency or disaster drills. She only verbalizes the procedures to the children. However, it is highly recommended that monthly documents drill be conducted.

(4) Sanitary

- The facility is odor free. Sanitization is practiced on a daily basis to prevent bacterial buildup. Clean Towels are provided and are replaced daily. Soap dispensers are readily available. However, the following is recommended:
 - Upon inspection, I discovered that the children's toothbrushes lacked the protective plastic covering. It is recommended that the children's toothbrushes be covered after ever use for sanitary purposes.

(5) Outdoor

• The facility's outdoor playground is safe for the children enrolled at this Day Care Center. The playground is fenced. *There are no discrepancies or violations to report.*

(6) Capacity

• The outdoor as well as the indoor facility for this Provider complies with the required square footage of space per child. *There are no discrepancies or violations to report.*

(7) Health

• Some of the children's health insurance and their emergency contacts are available at the Providers facility file. The staffs are washing their hands before and after eating as well as properly sanitizing counters/tables/chairs tops. Infant formulas as well as prescribed medications are properly stored. *There are no discrepancies or violations to report.*

(8) Documents

• The Prover's Provisional CCL expires on **December 5**, **2017**. *Therefore*, *there are no discrepancies or violations to report*.

(9) Other

- Drinking water dispenser is readily available at all times for staff and children. However, the following is recommended:
 - Upon inspection, I observed a Clorox container on the floor by the children's toilet. It is paramount that all cleaning supplies are properly stored and out of the children's reach.
 - I observed that some of the children's playing equipment situated in the playground appeared weathered. This needs to be removed and replaced with a more suitable equipment. Additionally, wilted banana leaves were present within the playground. This too must be removed for the children's safety.
