Staff/Child Ratio:

The provider is in compliance with the Staff/Child ratio for child care programs in the classifications of "Day Care Centers and Infant and Toddlers Child Care Centers" in accordance with TITLE 55 SUBCHAPTER 55-40.1 *CHILD CARE STANDARDS RULES AND REGULATIONS* Part 200 Subpart C § 55-40.1-228 and Part 400 Subpart C § 55-40-1-426. *No discrepancies noted.*

1. Electrical:

• It was noted during the inspection that an electrical outlet in the toddler room and two in each of the K4-5 classrooms were exposed and within reach of children. However, upon notifying staff members of infraction, child-proof devices were readily available, exposed outlets protected, and discrepancy corrected on-site.

2. Signage:

• Signages were clearly visible and posted within designated areas. *No discrepancies noted.*

3. Emergency:

Emergency kits/equipment are readily available. Centralized smoke detector system is installed.
 Emergency drills noted to be practiced and logged. However, it was observed that the last evacuation drill was conducted in April of 2017. It is highly recommended that emergency drills be practiced more frequently.

4. Sanitation:

During inspection of the toddler lavatory, a child toilet adapter was noticed to contain urine. It is
recommended by the Child Care Licensing Program that the adapter be thoroughly cleaned after
every use to maintain sanitary standards and prevent any future health issues.





5. Outdoor:

• Outdoor equipment is appropriate for age group, serviceable, and grounds well maintained. Toddler's outdoor play area is fenced and away from main roadways. *No discrepancies noted*.

6. Capacity:

• The facility capacity requirements are met per the issuance of a valid Occupancy permit and observed during inspection. *No discrepancies noted*.

7. Health:

• Children's health information is available for review by authorized personnel when needed. Though no isolation room exists, a procedure for ill children is in place. Upon notice of obvious symptoms by staff members, parents/guardians are notified. A decision is then made by staff whether to accept child for care or parents advised for pick up. *No discrepancies noted*.

8. Documents:

• All required licenses and applicable documentation observed, were current, clearly visible, and placed in an organized fashion. *No discrepancies noted*

9. Other:

• Upon inspection of the south K4-5 classroom, it was discovered that several drawers contained cooking utensils such as knives, forks, and other sharp items. Drawers were not protected with child-proof devices. This poses a hazard to children. Therefore, it is in the best interest of Brilliant Star Montessori School to remove these items from the classrooms or install child-proof devices on the drawers.

NOTE: It is highly advised that appropriate actions be taken regarding the recommendations contained in this report.
