- On December 28, 2017, a Renewal inspection was conducted by Child Care Licensing Program Safety Inspector, George R. Fleming in the presence of Acting Supervisor, Mr. Gordon B. Salas. Upon inspection of the K4 classroom, it was noted that a potentially dangerous situation existed. A faucet was located a few inches away from an electrical outlet. A television was also located just a few inches above the same faucet. Mr. Rex Penaroyo of R&EQ Day and Night Care Center was notified of the hazard. Furthermore, on January 16, 2018, a monitoring inspection was conducted by Mr. Fleming to follow-up on the status of corrective actions required to be performed to eliminate the hazard. After further inspection of the area of concern, the hazard was deemed non-existent. Therefore, no further action is required.
