Staff Child Ratio

The provider is in compliance with the Staff/Child ratio for child care programs in the classifications of "Day Care Centers and Infant and Toddlers Child Care Centers" in accordance with Title 55 SUBCHAPTER 55-40.1 *CHILD CARE STANDARDS RULES AND REGULATIONS* Part 200 Subpart C § 55-40.1-228 and Part 400 Subpart C § 55-40-1-426. *No discrepancies noted.*

(1) Electrical

• It was noted during the inspection that an electrical outlet in the K3 classroom room were not properly safeguarded. However, child-safe devices were readily available and infraction was corrected on-site.

(2) Signage

• Signages were clearly visible and posted within designated areas. *No discrepancies noted*

(3) Emergency

• Emergency kits/equipment were properly installed and readily available. Smoke detectors installed and functional in each enclosed room. *No discrepancies noted*

(4) Sanitation

The facility was observed to be clean. Paper towels are provided and replenished as needed.
 Soap dispensers are easily accessible. Proper sanitation is being practiced. No discrepancies noted.

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(5) Outdoor

• Outdoor play area is well-maintained, enclosed with a chain-linked fence, and away from roadways. *No discrepancies noted*.

(6) Capacity

• Facility capacity meets CCLP requirements per the issuance of a valid Occupancy permit and observed during the inspection. *No discrepancies noted.*

(7) Health

• Upon inspection of the infant restroom, cleaning agents were found underneath the sink. Staff was notified of the infraction. Cleaning agents were then removed by staff and placed in location inaccessible to children.

(8) <u>Documents</u>

• A Provisional Child Care License has been issued effective December 15, 2017 with an expiration date of March 15, 2018. All required documents are current, clearly visible, and posted in a conspicuous area.
