Staff Child Ratio:

The provider is in compliance with the Staff/Child ratio for child care programs in the classifications of "Day Care Centers, Before and After School, and Infant and Toddlers Child Care Centers" in accordance with Part 200 Subpart C § 55-40.1-228 and Part 400 Subpart C § 55-40-1-426 of SUBCHAPTER 55-40.1 CHILD CARE STANDARDS RULES AND REGULATIONS. No discrepancies noted.

1. Electrical:


- A 220-volt electrical outlet in the *K3 classroom* located by a window, was noted to be exposed and without installed child-protective devices.
- An electrical outlet located in the *K3 class restroom* above the urinal, was noted to be exposed and without installed child-protective devices.
- A multi-outlet cord placed on the K5 classroom teacher's desk was noted to be exposed and without installed child-protective devices. Based on the electrical safety findings above, the following is recommended:
 - Install child-protective devices on all electrical outlets within reach of children and below 7 ft in height to mitigate the risk of injuries or death caused by electrical hazards.

2. Signage:

• Signages are clearly visible and posted in designated areas. *No discrepancies noted*.

3. Emergency:

- Emergency kits/equipment were properly installed and readily available. However, the first aid kit inspected in the K5 classroom was low in quantity with bandages. Staff was made aware. The following is recommended:
 - Replenish supply of bandages in the first aid kit located in the K5 classroom.





- Emergency drills are practiced at regular intervals and consistent in terms of frequency. However, a certain type of drill (ex. Fire drill) is only practiced for 4 months. Upon completion of the 4th month, a new type of drill is then practiced for the next 4. To maintain proficiency and enhance the preparedness of the school, the following is recommended:
 - It is recommended to alternate between the type of drill being practiced monthly. For example, rather than practicing just fire drills for 4 months, alternate between the 4 different types of drills (fire, lock-down, typhoon, and earthquake) every month to maintain the proficiency of staff and students whilst familiarizing procedures of other drills.

4. Sanitation:

• The facility was observed to be odorless. Clean paper towels are provided and replenished daily. Soap dispensers are easily accessible. *No discrepancies noted*.

5. Outdoor:

- Outdoor play area contained age appropriate materials and equipment. However, children are exposed to sharp objects such as tin roofing materials, scrap metal, and large rocks. The following s recommended to mitigate the risks of injury:
 - Provide a barrier between the area that the sharp objects are located.

6. Capacity:

• The facility capacity requirements are met per the issuance of the occupancy permit and observed during the CCLP unannounced inspection. *No discrepancies noted.*

7. Health:

• Children's health information is available for review when needed. Though no isolation room exists, a procedure for ill children is in place. Upon notice of obvious symptoms by staff, parents are notified to pick up child.

8. Documents:

• All required licenses and applicable documentation observed were current, clearly visible, and placed in an organized fashion. *No discrepancies noted*.

9. Other:

- Lighting in the K3 class restroom is poor and presents hazards to children in that age group. A boarded-up window was noticed and could potentially provide the much-needed lighting in the restroom. Therefore, the following is recommended:
 - Open up the boarded window or procure a lightbulb with a higher output.

NOTE: It is advised that corrective action be taken regarding all discrepancies contained in this report (if any).
